Recycling tips

- Discard the seals under the lids of plastic ONS bottles.
- Wash out the ONS bottles/cartons, squash and screw the lid back on this helps the recycling processing machines detect and sort the products into the correct stream.
- Take recyclable ONS sachets (check packaging) along with other 'soft plastics', to a front-of-store supermarket collection point.
