What's different about graduate membership?

- Cost: £167.90 (50% of full membership)
- You can pay monthly instead of all at once (£14.30 a month)
- Full professional indemnity insurance included as standard (a legal requirement to practice as a registered dietitian)
- Trade Union support
- HCPC representation
- Specialist groups become paid leave them before you renew if you don't want them to continue

Can I re-join as a graduate member?

✓ It is not possible to join as a graduate member via the BDA website.

This offer is only available to existing student members to transfer to.

If you cancel your student membership and re-join the BDA when you begin practising, you will have to join as a full member and pay the full amount (£335.80).

Staying on as a graduate member can save over £160 for your first full year of membership as a registered dietitian – extra cash when

I'm an existing student member - when will I become a graduate member?

Your graduate membership will begin on the first of the month following your course end date

When will my first payment be collected?

- On the day that your graduate membership begins (first of the month). You'll receive an advanced direct debit notification at least 10 working days prior via email to let you know exactly when the payment will be taken.
- Most students pay by annual direct debit. If you would prefer to pay via monthly instalments, please email <u>membership@bda.uk.com</u> at least one month prior to your graduate membership start date.
- If you pay by credit/debit card, you'll be emailed a month prior to your upgrade, inviting you to log on to the website and make payment online.



Next steps

I'm not currently a BDA member – how can I become a graduate member?

- Join us today as a student member and enter your course end date during the application process. You'll be automatically upgraded to graduate membership the following month.
- **7** If you have already graduated but were previously a BDA student member, please email<u>membership@bda.uk.com</u>.

Is there anything else I need to be aware of?

- **Update your email address**! Many students sign up with their university email, however you'll soon lose access to this once you've graduated. Make sure to log in to your MyBDA portal before graduation to change your email address to a more permanent one that future BDA updates can be sent to. <u>Update my email address</u>
- Don't forget to update your home address too so you can receive physical copies of DT! Update my home address
- Add your employment details to your MyBDA portal when you find a job. This will ensure you can take part in NHS pay consultations and have a say in the future of the profession. <u>My work and education BDA</u>
- **Zeave any specialist groups you no longer want to be a part of** at least one month prior to your renewal! They will become payable.
