Muscle Health Research Study

**Are you a Dietitian currently registered and



Then read on...

Brief background to the research:

Over the past 10 to 15 years, our knowledge about sarcopenia and muscle health has grown significantly, and we now have recommendations for the assessment and management of the condition.

Despite this, a diagnosis of sarcopenia is rarely made in healthcare practice, collaboration between healthcare practitioners to identify and address the condition is lacking, and there is a distinct absence of public-facing initiatives to raise awareness of how to prevent or delay a decline in muscle health. These factors pose a barrier to the promotion of healthier ageing.



The term 'Knowledge mobilisation' is used to describe the process of "getting the right information from different places and sharing it" (Health Education England, 2021). A strategy for achieving this, is to influence 'mindlines', the 'flexible, guidelines in the head' that we all use to process and share knowledge, and to make decisions.

This study will seek to work with AHPs involved in the field of older persons healthcare (dietitians, physiotherapists, and occupational therapists), and lay older people, to investigate and establish their mindlines around sarcopenia and muscle health using semi-structured interviews. The researcher will then work alongside the AHPs and older people to co-design ways to influence those mindlines and enable knowledge sharing. It is hoped that this will lead to the development of tools and resources that meet 'real world' needs, enabling the recommendations that we have around sarcopenia and muscle health to become more practical and user friendly.
